JOHN YOUNG

At a court began and held at May term 1792 the following last will and testament of John Young, Sen^r, was presented in open court and proven by the oath of Anna Stevenson & Mary Stevenson and ordered to be recorded with this done this 31st day of August 1792.

In the name of God Amen, I John Young, sen^t being sick of body but of good and perfect memory and understanding do hereby make and confirm my last will & testament in manner & form following, viz, first after the discharge of all my lawful debts I give and bequeath to my grandson John Young, son of my eldest son John one shilling. And I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Stevenson my pewter, dresser, chest and bedstead, and the remaining part of my worldly estate to be equally divided betwⁿ my well beloved son Samuel Young and my well beloved daughter Mary Stevenson afore^d lastly I nominate & appoint my son Samuel Young afore^d my lawful executor to see this my last will executed in confirmation whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this nineteenth day of January in the year of our ord one thousnd and seven hundred and ninety two.
