JOSEPH A ATWATER

In the name of God Amen. I Joseph A Atwater of Connecticut New Haven County now of South Carolina Allsaints Parris being weak in body. But of a sound mind blessed be God. Do constitute this my last Will and Testament. First consigning my Body to Its mother dust from which it came Desiring to be Buried in the Christian form Having a tomb stone erected to my memory Secondly Recommending my soul to Almighty God, Hoping for a Blessed Resurrection in the merits of Jesus Christ As to my Worldly Goods I give as follows. First that all my just debts be paid, And then the Remainder to be equally divided between my beloved Wife Sarah and my beloved Son Joseph William to them and their Heirs forever But in case of Either dying Leaving no Heir their half to descend to the other at their his or her Death - Leaving my beloved Wife Sarah and my Friend ----- Executors to this my last Will and Testament Signed with my own hand Acknowledged, Sealed, and delivered this 27th August 1815 In presence of ----
