these presents sealed with our seals and dated this Eleventh day of  
February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty  
two and in the seventy sixth year of American Independence

Whereas the said John Causay has become the purchaser of  
a tract of land sold as the property of the Estate of F J Hurl deceased  
and the condition of this obligation is such that if the said John Causay  
shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid to the said James Beatty  
Ordinary or his successors or assigns the sum of one hundred and fifty  
eight dollars as follows to wit one third to be paid on the second day  
of February A.D 1853 One third to be paid on the second day of February A.D 1854  
and one third to be paid on the second day in February A.D 1855 the whole carrying  
interest from the second day of February 1852 without further delay than this obligation  
to be made void otherwise of full force and virtue witness our hands and seals
