WM. HENRY LEWIS

In the Name of God Amen, I ^{do} Henry Lewis of the State of South Carolina, Horry District, being Sick and Weak in Body but of a perfect mind and Memory, thanks be given unto God calling unto the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die do Make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament Vis. My Soul I recomend to the Hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Body to be buried in a desent Manner; and as touching such worldly Estate were- with it as pleased God to blefs me with I give in the follow- ing Manner and form, first it is my Will and desire that all my Just debts be paid by my Executors hereafter Named Item I give and bequeath to my wife Rachel Lewis One Negroe Named Hardtimes, Four hundred Acres of Land on either side of my Land she pleases Item and the remainder of my property both Real and Personal I give to be divided equally amongst my Children (when my debts is paid and not before) but should any of them die without leaving lawfull Issue then their property to be equal divided amongst the surviveing Children and I do hereby utterly dis- allow, revoke and disanul, all and every other former Testa- ments, Wills, Legacies, Bequeaths and Executors, by me in any ways before Named as I do hereby ordain and appoint my beloved friend Paul Michau Executors of this my last Will and Testament, ratifying and confirming this and no other, to be my last Will and Testament. In Witnefs whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Fourth day of Novem- ber and in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Five and in the Thirtieth Year of the Independence of the United States of America
