The Petition of John Squires sheweth that his father William Squires died intestate, being possessed in his lifetime of certain lands lying in Horry District in Spring Swamp & Brunsan Swamp viz four tracts lying on the north side of Spring Swamp containing about two hundred and seventy five acres and one tract lying on or near the head of Brunsan Swamp containing about two hundred acres and one containing in the whole four hundred and seventy five acres more or less. - your petitioner therefore prays that the above lands may be sold for Division amongst the heirs of said William Squires.

Upon filing the above petition and Affidavit, a summons in Partition was issued, and on Friday 3d September 1843, John Squires, Robert Squires and John Lawrence attended at a Court of Ordinary appointed on that day. No objections being made to a sale (it was deemed impossible to divide without injury to the parties) It was decreed & ordered by the Ordinary to sell the lands of the said William Squires, on the first Monday in October, or some other convenient sale day, on the following terms, so much as will be necessary to pay expenses of Partition to be paid in Cash and the balance payable in six months, Purchasers giving Bond with approved security bearing interest from the day of sales.

Oct 4th 1841. The Sheriff sold the lands of said Estate the whole amounting to four hundred and seventy five acres more or less. The Hux Purchaser for \$22. and after deducting the Sheriff and Ordinary fees for Partition the Ordinary took Thos. Hux & C. B. Sarris note payable at 6mos. bearing interest from 4th Oct. 1841 for \$5.
