

In the Name of God Amen, I William Vereen Jun Knowing that all Men are once to die and being Sick in Body tho of perfect Mind and Memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament Item it is my wish and desier that all my Just debts be paid as hereafter directed Item I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Vereen and the Heirs of her body for ever all my Estate Except the Legacies hereafter Mentioned, Item I Give and bequeath to my Son Charles Vereen the following Negro's Cuffee Ben Grippa and Smart, Item I Give and bequeath to My Son Jeremiah Vereen the Following Negro's James Fortune Lucy and Rederick And it is my Will and desier that My Executors do as Quick as possible obtain Titles for the plantation where I now reside from the Sheriff of Horry there being paid unto him two hundred dollars towards the same Item it is my positive Will and desier that My Executors do Sell any part of My Estate that is not already bequeathed to pay my lawful debts as they may think most proper, Item Should Either of my sons depart this Life before they Arive to the Age of twenty one Years in that case Either child's part to be Equally divided between their Mother and the Surviving Child, Item I Give and bequeath to my Friend Charles Fullwood fifty dollars, Item I give my Wife My Horse and Chair Household and Kitchen furniture and Mill not to be any otherway desposed of, Item I give unto My Brother Jeremiah Vereen my blew close bodied coat and Greate Coat Item, should boath my Children die before they arive to the age of twentyone Years in that case I Give and bequeath unto William Vereen son of Daniel Vereen a Negro Man Cuffee - And James to Mary Ann Vereen daughter to Jeremiah Vereen And I make and Ordain my Friends Major John A Alston and Charles Fullwood my whole and Sole Executors to this my Last Will and Testament revoking all others Signed Seeld and delivered this Ninth day of January in the Year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and eleven
