EBENEZER BAGNALL

In the Name God Amen, I Ebenezer Bagnall at present of Charles-Town, being of Sound Mind Do make publish Pronounce & declare this my last Will in manner following, that is to say, First I will that my body be decently Buried, at the discretion of my Executors, Item, I give and Bequeath unto my Cousins Ebenezer Bagnal, John Bagnal, Isaac Bagnal & Rebecca Martin & Mary Toby the sum of Twenty Pounds Sterling each, to be paid as soon as Convenient after my decease, Item, I give and Bequeath, to my Friends John Bready and John McCambridge the Sum of Ten pounds Sterling each, and all the rest residue & Remainder of my Estate I do give devise & Bequeath to three of my nearest Relations in the Kingdom of Ireland Equally to be divided amongst them, and that my Executor may be enabled to discharge such my Debts & Legacies I do hereby point out the following Heads, towit, the Sum of One hundred & Fifty pounds Sterling left in the Hands of ^{rs} W. Susanna Flood Widow and Six thousand Continental Dollars, and such Balances as shall appear due to me from ^r M. John Chesnut, And lastly I do hereby Nominate constitute & appoint, my Friends, John Adamson And John Chesnut both of Charlestown Executors of this my last Will In testimony whereof I have hereto Set my Hands & Seal this Eighth day of August 1781 and in the Twenty First year of his Majestys' Reign.
