I Elisabeth Bracey, late Elisabeth Arguin, wife of Gayetan Arguin, Tin worker of Camden-but now wife of William Bracey of Camden-being sick and weak in Body, but of perfect mind and memory-do make and ordain this my last will and Testament That is to say-first all that my Body be buried in a decent, Christian like manner at the Discretion of my Executors-the Expenses of which with all my just debts I will shall be paid--

Item I will and direct that the whole of my personal Estate shall be divided Share and Share alike between my husband William Bracey, and my four Children (viz) Gayetan Arguin, Jane Arguin, Frances Arguin, and Joseph Ulysses Arguin-that is-that it shall be divided into five equal parts or shares-one of which I give to each of my above named Legatees-to them their heirs and assigns forever-and if any of my above named Children should die before they come of age, then the Share of such, so dying, shall be equally divided amongst my surviving Children--

Item-it is my will that the real Estate of my late husband Gayetan Arguin, now in my possession shall continue in the Charge and Possession of my present husband William Bracey--untill my son Gayetan Arguin shall arrive at the Age of Twenty one years, and shall be divided Share and Share alike between my four Children above named or the survivors of them to them their heirs and assigns forever--

Item it is my will that my son Gayetan Arguin shall when at the proper age be bound Apprentice to the Trade of a Tin worker at the Discretion of my Executors-and that all the Tools of his

shall be reserved for him in the Possession of him when he arrives
