In the Name of God Amen I James Crawford late of the County of Antrim in the Kingdom of Ireland, being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament that the expences of my funeral be first paid together with all my lawfull debts. Item that an exact Inventory be made out. of all these goods and Chattels of which I die possessed an account of which shall be as soon as convenient after my death transmitted to Arthur Harper Merchant in Elliot Street Charleston. to be afterwards disposed of as may directed by the said Arthur Harper. And in the mean time my goods and Chattels as above mentioned shall remain in the possession and Keeping of my trusty friends Isaac Alexander & Hugh M Howel both of Camden whom I do Hereby nominate My Executors with full power to do every thing that may be necessary for the safety of my goods and Chattels until the before named Arthur Harper can have an opportunity to take measures for the further disposal of the same and after my just debts in Charleston are paid under the direction of the said Arthur Harper, tis my Will that he shall transmit whatever balance may remain in his hands to James Davidson Merchant in the town of Antrim in the County of Antrim Ireland together with a full statement of the money of which he may have disposed and settled my affairs committed to his charge Signed Sealed and acknowledged as my last Will and Testament.
