In the Name of God Amen, I - John Platt of the State of South Carolina, Being in a Low State of health But of perfect mind and Memory Knowing it is appointed for all Men once to Die. To make and ordain this to Be my Last Will and Testament, first I Give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that Gave it and my Body to the Earth to Be Buryed in a Decent Charitable Manner, at the Discretion of my Executor Nothing Doubting But at the General Resurrection I Shall receive the Same By the power of God, And Touching Such worldly Estate wherewith it hath please God to Blefs me with In this Life I Give and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form after paying my just Debts First I Give and Bequeath to my well Beloved wife Nancy Platt, Two Negre fellows Named Bob and Samson and all my Household furniture During her widowhood or Marriage, and if She Should marry then the property To Return to my Son William Pig Platt, I mean the above Legacy is in the Liew of her Dowry — Secondly I give and Bequeath to my well Beloved Son William pig Platt one Negro fellow Named Olive and a French Named Tomar and her Two Children one mare and Colt and one Cow and Calf with their futer Increase to him and his heirs and Assigns for Ever. And further I Do appoint my Beloved friend Douglas Starkes my Executor to this my Last will and Testament Given under my hand and Seal this Seventeenth Day of December one thousand Seven hundred and Ninety -
