WILLIAM WYLY

In the Name of God Amen, I William Wyly of Camden in the District of Camden, being Sick and Weak of Body but of Sound perfect and dispeosing Memory, thanks be to God, Do make Ordain and Constitute this my Last Will and Testament, Revoking hereby all former Wills heretofore by me made. In manner and following form, That is to Say First that all my just Debts and Funeral Expenses, after my Decease Be paid at the Discretion of my Executors herein after Named, as Soon as Covenient, And as to Such Worldey Estate as I am Indowed with I give Devise and Bequeath thereof, In Manner and form following That is to Say I Bequeath unto my Dearly Beloved "Wife Elizabeth Wyly, One Intre Third part of my Estates, Real and personal During her Natural Life and no Longer" and at her Decease, all Such One third Part to Devolve to my Daughter Dinah Wyly, To whom I Will and Bequeath all the Residue of my Estates, as heretofore Mentioned In Case of my Said Daughter Dinah Wyly Deceasing Without Issue, My Will is that the Whole of the afore Mentioned Estates Devolve and Be equally divided among James Willson Lang, Samuel Lang and John Wyly Lang, Sons of William and Sarah Lang, Share and Share alike, and to their and each of their heirs, lawfull forever. But Admit My Daughter Dinah Shall live and Join in the Holy Bands of Matrimony and Shall have Issue them, and in that Case all the Estates heretofore Mentioned By me my Will is that all Such Estate, Belong to the Heirs of her Body lawfully Begotten, to their, his Or her heirs forever, and further my Will is that Immediately after my Decease My Beloved Sister Sarah Lang take into her Care and full Charge. My Daughter Dinah Wyly to Be under her Sole and full Management, and Care, untill she shall Either Marry Or Become of Perfect Age, as Well under the Care of My Executors herein Named William Lang, John Cheamut, and John Millhouse, and that they, my Executors do from time to time pay Out of the Rents & Profits arising from Such Residue as hereinbefore Named Such Sum and Sums of Money as may be Requisite and Necesfary for the Education, Clothing and Maintenance of My Daughter Dinah Wyly heretofore Named and Agreeable to the Time and times above Named.

Lastly, My Will is that at or Immediately after My Decease, that a Certain Negroe Man Slave Tomey Now my Property Be to all Interest Given his Freedom forever In Witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand Seal the Thirteenth Day of November 1785, and in the Tenth year of Our Independence.
