State and District - forsooth being in a low State of health and  
of sound mind and memory and calling to mind that all have to  
depart this life and being desirous of disposing of my property  
that it may please God to cleve me with his life -

First it is my will and pleasure that my Body should be buried  
in a decent Manner at the discretion of my Friends and Executor

2ndly that my just debts - no funeral expenses shall be paid -

3rdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Marina Alexander one  
large Circle Dishes one feather bed and furniture and one S-in-  
ning which on 4thly I give and bequeath unto my Daughter John one  
tract of land of ~~243~~ acres here I now live to her and her heirs

for ever also one bed and furniture and one equal half of all  
my household and kitchen furniture that I will give and bequeath

to my Daughter Charlotte ~~John~~ one Negro boy Sandrick and equal  
half of my house hold and kitchen furniture to her and her heirs

... good house and furniture old and young chairs and one sofa  
being witness thereto I sign and bequeath unto my Daughter John one  
half of half of my property here I now give to her and her heirs  
for ever also one bed and furniture and one equal half of all  
my household and kitchen furniture that I will give and bequeath  
to my daughter Charlotte Miller and Major Joseph Sistrick one equal  
half of my house hold and kitchen furniture to her and her heirs  
for ever--

In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal I do hereby  
appoint Mr. Dunlap my Executor to carry into My last Will in a  
responsible signed sealed and declared in my presence and in the  
presence of me 9th day of May 1823--
