of sound mind and memory and calling to mind that all have to
depart this life and being desirous of disposing of my property
that it may least need to cleave me with in this life--

First it is my will and pleasure that my body should be buried
in a decent Manner at the discretion of my Friends and Executor

2ndly that my Just debts and funeral expences shall be paid--

3rdly I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martine Alexander one
Negro Girl Dissa one feather bed and furniture and one S. in-
ning machine 4thly I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Joia one
tract of land of 213 acres where I now live to her and her heirs
for ever also one bed and furniture and one equal half of all
my household and kitchen furniture that 5thly I give and bequeath
to my Daughter Charloet Fulton one Negro boy Sadrick one equal
half of my house hold and kitchen furniture to her and her heirs

my wife Ann and father and furniture and one spinning wheel 4thly I give and bequeath unto my Daughter John one tract of land of 243 acres where I now live to her and her heirs for ever also one bed and furniture and one equal half of all my household and kitchen furniture that I give and bequeath to my Daughter Charlotte Pulkin one Negro boy Siedrick one equal half of my house hold and kitchen furniture to her and her heirs for ever--

In witness whereof I have set my hand and Seal I do hereby appoint Mr. Dunlap my Executor to carry this My Last Will in execution signed sealed and Declared in my presence and in the presence of us 9th day of May 1823--
