Anderson Mc Anderson and Elizabeth Jones all my possessions  
after the payment of my last debts, chiefly consisting of notes  
of hand accounts of a horse and small flock of cattle house  
hold & kitchen furniture with some other tools and farm  
appurtenances and other property which I cannot at  
this time think of all of the above named property  
and all the money which I may have about myself  
or in the care of any other person I intend for my brother  
and sister above named to have and to hold forever  
to be appropriated to whatever use they may think  
fit. I want them to share it equally between them  
to be divided according to their own will and fancy  
I leave my Brother Anderson Mc Anderson my sole  
Executor to settle up all demands against me and to  
collect all that is coming to me I believe that Mr  
John Cook & the last Physicians bills are all the debts  
I now owe. Given under my hand and seal  
this 2nd March one thousand eight hundred and thirty  
nine and in the fifty fourth year of American Independ-

Memorandum that the will of Edward Jones was  
proven before me in the court of ordinary on the first  
day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine by  
the oath of William Phillips

In the name of God Amen I James Hamilton of Laurens  
District & State aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind  
& memory & calling to mind the uncertainty of life and being  
desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath  
pleased God to bless me with do make and ordain this  
my last will in manner following that is to say  
I give to my daughter Elizabeth Taylor one negro girl

named Edith and one boy named Henry & one small  
maggon & one cloth Loom I give to my son in law  
William Mills & my daughter Margaret Mills one negro  
boy named Fob one cow & calf. I give to my daughter  
Nancy McClintock one negro woman named Mary  
and her increase and one child called Emily one small  
Man & scott all my horse and hold & kitchen furniture  
not otherwise mentioned all my plantation tools namely  
plough Hoes axes mattocks and one half of all my  
stock of hogs I give to my son John McClintock  
one negro woman named Lotin and one boy named  
Andrew and all the crop & provisions that I may have  
on hand only so much as may be necessary for sup-  
port for Nancy McClintock & her negroes till she can  
make a crop also one half of my hogs I give to my  
Grand daughter Jane Taylor one clay Bank or cream Colored  
Cott. I give to my Grand daughter Elizabeth Taylor one Bed  
& furniture I give to my Grand daughter Mary Juliet Mills  
one sorrel horse known by the name of Zond I give to  
my Grand daughter Jane McClintock one hundred and fifty  
dollars. It is my will that if I have any lawful claim  
to the negroes or any part of them that have been distributed  
among my children that they keep them as they got them  
that is to say Elizabeth Taylor to keep the boy Solomon  
Margaret Mills to keep the boy Joe & the girl Caroline  
Nancy McClintock to keep the boy Pie & girl Mary Ann  
and John McClintock to keep the boy crop I give  
to my daughter Nancy McClintock all that tract or par-  
cel of land whereon I now live to a line running  
from a stake corner near the Spring to a stake corner  
on John Jones line near the school house Spring to have  
and to hold during her life time after her death to be divided  
between all my sons and children. I give to my son  
John McClintock and his heirs forever all the balance of my  
tract of land being that part on which he now lives  
lying north of the above line and more particularly by  
survey made is a deed of gift made by me to him  
some years since and witnessed by William Brown Esq  
and Margaret McClintock all the Rest of my estate  
both Real & personal not here in this power of I desire  
may be given to my son John out of which he is  
to pay all my last debts and funeral expenses  
and also to pay the above named legacy of one hundred and fifty  
dollars to my Grand daughter Jane or in case she
