

WILL OF CHARLES GAREY

In the name of God, Amen. I Charles GAREY, being weak in body but sound in mind and well, knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and constitute this my last will and testament. I desire that my body be buried in a decent christian manner at the discretion of my Executors uner named. 2 As to my worldly estate as I am possessed of I give and bequeath as follows after all my lawful debts are paid, I give and bequeath unto my beloved friend Milley COKER all my house furniture, working tools wearing apparel, forever as also the tract of land I now live on with the use of the house and plantation during her natural life time as long as she remains single. And after her marriage or decease it is my will and desire that my antural daughter Casonalry COKER is to have the said tract of land and plantation to her use and behalf forever. As also all my personal estate of every kind whatsoever. 3rd, I give and bequeath unto the said Milley COKER one brown bay mare and saddle during the time she remains single, and after her death or marriage it is my will and sense that said mare shall be also be the property of my said natural daughter Casondry COKER. And I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Drway COKER and my brother David GARY Executors to this my last will and testament. Renouncing and revoking all other wills and whatsoever. Signed, sealed, and pronounced in presence of this 22nd day of February, 1805.
