 John Cook & the last Physicians bills are all the debts

 District & State aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind  
 & Memory & calling to mind the uncertainty of life and being  
 desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath  
 pleased God to Bless me with do make and ordain this  
 my last will in manner following that is to say  
 I give to my daughter Elizabeth Taylor one negro girl

named Edith and one boy named Henry & one small  
 waggon & one Cattle Loom I give to my son in law  
 William Mills & my daughter Margerite Mills one negro  
 boy named Fob Tom Cow & calf. I give to my daughter  
 Nancy McClintock one negro woman named Mary  
 and her increase and one child called Emily one small  
 Man & scott all my house hold & Kitchen furniture  
 not otherwise mentioned all my plantations tools namely  
 plough Hoes axes mattocks &c and one half of all my  
 stocks of Hogs I give to my son John McClintock  
 one negro Man named John and one boy named  
 Andrew and all the crop & provisions that I may have  
 on hand only so much as may be necessary for subsi-  
 stent for Nancy McClintock & her negroes till she can  
 make a crop also one half of my hogs I give to my  
 Grand daughter Jane Taylor one delay Bank or cream Colours  
 Cote. I give to my Grand daughter Elizabeth Taylor one bed  
 & furniture I give to my Grand daughter Mary Juliet Mills  
 one Sorrel horse known by the name of Tom I give to  
 my Grand daughter Jane McClintock one hundred and fifty  
 Dollars. It is my will that if I have any lawfull claim  
 to the negroes or any part of them that have been distributed  
 among my children that they keep them as they got them  
 that is to say Elizabeth Taylor to keep the boy Solomon or  
 Margerite Mills to keep the boy Joe & the girl Caroline  
 Nancy McClintock to keep the boy Pie & girl Mary Ann  
 and John McClintock to keep the boy arup I give  
 to my daughter Nancy McClintock all that tract or par-  
 cel of land where on I now live to a line running  
 from a Stake corner near the Spring to a stake corner  
 on John Deans line near the school house Spring to have  
 and to hold during her life time after her death to be divided  
 between all my Grand children. I give to my son  
 John McClintock and his heirs forever all the balance of my  
 tract of land being that part on which he now lives  
 lying north of the above line and more particularly by  
 survey made in a deed of gift made by me to him  
 some years since and witnessed by William Cowan Esq  
 and Margerite McClintock all the part of my estate  
 both Real & personal not here in disposed of I desire  
 may be given to my son John out of which he is  
 to pay all my Just debts and funeral expenses  
 and also to pay the above named legacy of one hundred dollars

 posing mind and memory reflecting on the uncertainty of life and  
 being desirous of disposing of my estate which it has pleased  
 God to bless me with to make and ordain this my last will &  
 Testament I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Dunlap a tract  
 of land lying in Newberry District known by the name of Salina  
 also known which he has since sold and disposed of containing  
 Two Hundred and forty seven acres more or less also a house and lot  
 in the village of Newberry which was conveyed to me by my said son  
 Robert which he has also since sold and disposed of also the following  
 Negroes viz, James Isbell and her child Sally Jimas & Mild and all their  
 children in crease and also all the stock and other articles on the aforesaid  
 plantation for and during the term of his natural life and after his death  
 to his lawful issue. I give and bequeath unto my grand children  
 Sarah Dunlap William Dunlap Mary Dunlap Robert Dunlap Richard Dunlap  
 James Dunlap and Sophia, children of my son John Dunlap an equal  
 interest in the proceeds of the sale of five Hundred and fifty three acres  
 of land on which my son John was permitted adjoining land at  
 present owned by Doct. John Davis Capt. John Davis Gilbert Coffey and other  
 lands belonging to the estate of Thomas Reader and which tract of  
 land I direct my Executor herein after named to advertise and  
 sell on or about the first of January next on a credit of  
 one and two years and the net proceeds of the sale to

be equally divided and paid over to my aforesaid grand children  
 as they severally arrive to age or to their proper appointees & guardians  
 I have here to give in the life term of my son John give him the following  
 property viz, Joshua Lydia Maria Mary and her two children and  
 all their in crease and when in merchandise in cash the sum of four  
 hundred and twenty one dollars besides other personal property  
 deemed as an equal distribution in cash which they will receive on  
 a division of his estate. I give and bequeath unto William W. Simpson  
 Henry G. Young & Henry W. Barlingford in trust for the sole separate use and  
 benefit of my daughter Nancy and the lawful issue of her body the follo-  
 wing property viz, all that plantation or tract of land containing seven  
 hundred and fifty acres more or less lying on Little River adjoining land  
 of John O'Keefe the heirs of Robert Pasley Samuel Rodger Nancy Jones and on  
 Little River and the following Negroes viz, William Jack Sally Parmelia  
 Patsy Margaret Cantline Billy and her two children Obi and Gabriel and  
 all their future in crease one horse one mule fourteen head of cattle fifteen  
 or twenty head of hogs four hold and kitchen furniture now at the  
 place a carting machine and wheels and one pig & harness as well  
 every thing else on the aforesaid plantation not particularly  
 enumerated - It is my will and desire that all the aforesaid  
 property be and remain in the uninterrupted possession of my  
 said daughter Nancy also one fourth part of the remaining  
 household furniture which I & my wife may die possess of  
 and should my said daughter Nancy die having no lawful  
 issue of her body it is my will and desire that the aforesaid property  
 both real and personal revert back to my estate - I give and bequeath  
 unto my friends Doct. John W. Simpson Henry G. Young & Henry  
 W. Barlingford in trust for the sole separate use and benefit of my  
 daughter Margaret Dunlap and the lawful issue of her body  
 all that plantation or tract of land containing seven  
 hundred and twenty eight acres more or less adjoining land of  
 William Brown Henry Bill John Bryson Thomas Bryson John  
 Gary Newman Gary Samuel Gary & John Godfrey & Peter Rice  
 and ten Negroes subject to the life estate of my wife *Margaret*  
*Dunlap* in the event of my daughter's marriage in the  
 life term of my wife then it is my will and desire that the  
 aforesaid ten Negroes be named and set a part in families as near  
 as possible for my said daughter Margaret with the consent and  
 approbation of my wife and Executors herein after named as well  
 as all such stock household & kitchen furniture my Gold watch  
 chain and safety chain and on the death of my wife it is further my  
 will and pleasure all the remaining household & kitchen  
 furniture unto the exception of one fourth part already disposed
