of South Carolina Laurens District. This the 17th day of
 1840. In the name of God, Amen. Of being of sound and
 of mind and memory, but weak in body, and calling to mind
 the uncertainty of life and being desirous to dispose of all
 worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, do
 I ordain this my last will in manner following. I this
 be in my mind and I will to sister Nancy CHILDS and her son
 a negro boy named Ben, and also one feather bed, and two
 and one blanket, and one quilt, and also my cloke to
 Nancy. And also my bonnet to sister Nancy, and also all
 cloth, 1 half to sister Nancy and the other half to brother
 William OWING, Nancy and also 1 lady saddle to brother Will-
 iam OWING, Nancy and all my cows and calf to brother Will OWING
 to brother William OWINGS which is in the hands of Gran-
 allis and also \$69 which is in the hands of John GARRETT
 to be equally divided between my four brothers, namely;
 William OWINGS and Richd OWINGS and Archd OWINGS and John OWINGS.
