 of all I give unto my well belove Wife Nancy Whittington one hundred dollars  
 daughter  
 secondly I give to my beloved/ Hannah Murfee five dollars Thirdly I give to  
 beloved daughter Elisabeth Danna five dollars. Fourthly I give to my be-  
 loved daughter Nancy Hayes five dollars fifthly I give to my belove Son James  
 Whittington five dollars sixthly I give to my beloved son Nathaniel Whit-  
 tington<sup>Jun</sup>, all the balance of my property of Whatsoever it may Consists of both  
 Real and perishable I Constitute Make and ordain Nathaniel. Whittington, my  
 son And William Taylor son<sup>r</sup> my Executors to this my last Will and testament  
 Revoking and making void all other Wills by me hereto before made In witness  
 Whereof I have Enterchangeably set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of  
 February and in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and thirty-  
 seven and in the Sixtieth second year of American Independancy--
