severally make Oathe that Elisabeth Evans on the
second day of July in the year of our Lord one
Thousand seven hundred and seventy one being of
sound mind & memory & perfect understanding in
the house of Ann Evans near hunts bluff in the
said county of Marlborough during the last sick-
ness of the said Elisabeth made & declared her
noncupative Will as follows to wit I give to my
brothers George Evans two cows & two of my Negro
slaves & I give to my brother Daniel Evans one
Negro slave & I give to my sister Polly Haggins
all my Cloths & I also give to my sister Cella
Evans all my Ducks and that she the said Eliz-
abeth requested this deponent in her own pres-
ence and in the Presmnce of the other two depo-
nents to bear witness thath the above was her
will and that she she said Elisabeth died upon
the same day aforesaid in the house aforesaid.
