In the name of God, Amen; I Francis Whittington of the State of South Carolina, Marlborough District being of performend and memory knowing that it is once appointed for me to die, do make and this & no other to be my last II and To-stament.

First, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Patience Whittington one Negro Woman by name Lidea, and all my housel furniture and one sorrel mare, mare and two cows & calves and after all my lawful debts is paid out of my crop, then the remaining part which is left to be divided in four parts and partience to have one part, and the pine wood lands and one hand mill and the plantation tools and the fourth part of the hogs. Secondly, I give to Execiah Alison in trust for five years one Negro man Sam, and two girls Beck and Philice upon the proviso that he lends the use of them to my son Natheniel Whittington for the above term of time, and at the end of five years the above named Negroes, Sam Beck and Philice to be given also one half of the tract of land he now lives on, and one fourth part of my stock, and a fourth part of my present crop after my debts are paid......

Thirdly. I gave to Elizabet Allison and my three grand children, Sarah McTyer and Robert McTyer and William McTyer, and
all the rest of my grand children of Sd. Elizabeth Allison two
Neggo gifls by name Sude and Mina and one boy named Phillip,
and a fourth part of my present grop and stock after my debts
is paid out of the crop to be equally divided among the Sd. Ars,
as they shall arrive from time to time to the age of twenty one
years of married, upon the proviso that said Exekiah Allison or
his heirs do equally divide to my daughter Elizabeth and the
three children of Sd. McTyer into four Equal parts gaveing each
of the children of Sd. McTyer one equal part, but if the said
Alison doth not equally divide the property of Sd. McTyer as before mentioned then the part which I gave to Elizabeth and her
heirs to fall solely to the three children of said McTyer that

is to say, Sarah, Robert and William McTyer. Fourthly. I gave to my son Gadi Whitington one negro man by name Toney, and one boy Peter, another named Gato, one boy child named Bill also one negro girl named Lucy, and all the remaining part of my Rayel and personal estate.

Fifthly. I do nominate & appoint my son Gadi Whittinton and Execish Alisan my two lawful Executors, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament, this thirteenth day of Jily in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Sixteen.
