A MARLBOROUGH COUNTY DEPOSITION IN CHESTER COUNTY RECORD

The following deed is found in Chester County Deed Book K, pages 238-239:

19 Jan 1798, Before me Drury Roberts, one of the Judges of Marlborough County
personally appeared Solomon Quick and Elijah Quick who gave oath that some what
about 14 years past they were invited by a certain John Wallace to go with him and Rachel
Skipper and see them get married. They went to the house of Reverend Mr. Smith
who was living at that time in the county of Marlborough. After being there some time the
John Wallace & Rachel Skipper did stand up together when the sd Mr. Smith did read
in a publick manner the usual matrimonial ceremony & the sd John Wallace & Rachel
Skipper did agree to take each other as man & wife & the said Smith did declare them
such. The sd John Wallace & Rachel his wife has lived together as man & wife ever
since the time of their marriage until 3 or 4 years past when he left her with their
"three"] children which they had while they were together. /s/ Solomon (X) Quick, El
(X) Quick. [Clerk copied the signature as Eliz'th Quick but wrote Elijah Quick in
statement, possibly intending "Eliza"?].

Memorandum, 10 Jan 1798. Solomon Quick & Elizabeth Quick saith that the John
Wallace within mentioned was a low chunky made man & suppose him to be between
& 40 years of age & generally wore short curled hair & has a large scar on one of his
Elizabeth Quick saith that the sd Wallace told her it was occasioned by a Scale[?] of
Rock which was broke by a cannon ball. He generally uses his left hand & is what we
left handed. He has a tolerable large face with large jaws somewhat marked with the small
pox. The above description is agreeable to the best of our recollection. /s/ Solomon
Quick, Eliz'th (X) Quick in presence of J. Robertson.
