I give and bequeath fifty acres of said land to my beloved son Jonathan Cottingham Jr. to be laid out to him includ—

the remainder of S. tract which I purchased of George Runnel  
I give and bequeath to my beloved son Charles Cottingham.

I give and bequeath my old mare to my beloved son Thos.

Cottingham to be his own property from this day a delivery  
of which I have now made to him-----

I give and bequeath my bed and furniture to my beloved daughter Lydia Cottingham. I give and bequeath to my son Thomas

Cottingham my hogs to be his own from this day. And lastly

I do nominate and appoint my well beloved son Jonathan

Cottingham Executor of this my last Will & Testament & I

do her eby make null and void all other wills and gifts by  
me heretofore made & I do hereby ratify confirm pronounce

& declare this to be my last will and Testament.
