the time being in the said office, to their attorney or successors in office, to which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns jointly and severally, jointly by these presents, sealed with our seals and dated in the county aforesaid the first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety four, and of the Independence of the United States of America the Nineteenth. Whereas administration of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of Lewis Bonner deceased, was lately committed by the Judges of the County Court aforesaid unto the said Nancy Bonner.

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Nancy Bonner administratrix of the goods, chattels and credits of Lewis Bonner deceased, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Nancy Bonner or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for her and the same so made, do exhibit unto the said Court of Marlborough when she shall be thereunto required, and such goods, chattels and credits do well and truly administer according to law, and do make a just and true account of her doings and doings therein, when required by the said Court, and all the rest of the said goods, chattels and credits which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said administration, the same being first being allowed by the said Court, shall deliver and pay unto such persons as are respectively intitled to the same by law, and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and Testament was made by the said deceased, and the same be proved in Court, and the Executors obtain a certificate of the probate thereof, and the said Nancy Bonner do in such case, if required, render and deliver up the said Letters of administration then this obligation to be void or else to remain in full force
