I Luke Robeson of Marlborough District in the State of South Common planter being sick and weak of body, but of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, thanks be given unto God for the same, do make and Ordsin this my last Will and Testament. That is to say, First I recommend my Soul into the hand of God who gave it, nothing doubting but at the resurrection I shall receive the same again through his mighty power and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in a Christian-like and deceat manner, at the discretion of my executors, and touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to blefs me in this life I give, dispose of the Same in the manner and form following, that is to say,

First I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Obedience Robeson One feather had and furniture Two Cows and their calves and all my hogs, to be holden and used at her Own disposcretion, to her & her heirs forever, also I lend to her my
said plantation and houses I now possess with all the profits
and advantages thereunto apportaining during the time of her
widowhood.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Septhah Robeson at the time of the expiration of my wife's widowhood the plantation where—on I now live and all the lower part of my lands with all the profits and appertainensies thereunto belonging, which part is now divided off from the upper part by a line of new marked trees beginning at an old Corner of pine Stump, on the woods Side of my Land; thence running a strait course acrofs my land to the Sasafrafs Island cornering on a Maple, 3 chafs on my Creek lime the management ordering and disposing of the profits of which land I leave in the care and power of my executors until the time of of my said Septhah Robeson shall arrive to the age of twenty five years and not for my said Son to have the power and disposal of the same until he shall arrive to the said age of

twenty five years, but then to his & his heirs forever after my wifes enjoying the same during the time of her wodowhood I also give to my said Son Sephah my horse Colt to be fully posefsed at the time of his coming of the age of twenty one year. to him and his heirs forever and also one feather bed and fur

Item I give and bequeath to your Samuel Robeson all the remaining and upper part of my Lands with all and Singular the rights members heredilaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining to him and his heirs forever. Item I give anobequeath unto each of my Eight Children John Robeson Thomas Robeson, Leggitt Robeson, Christian Chamb bers, William Robeson and Obedience Appleson, and Sally Usery & Mary Usery the sum of five Shillings Sterling to be raised out of my present estate & paid to them by my executors.

My will and desire is that my Executors should make sale of my Still, and out of the money arrising from the sale therof pay all my Just debts and that they divide the Overplus of the same equally amongst my three sons, William Samuel & Septhah Robeson and I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint My Trusty & well beloved friends & Step sons William Adams, John Adams and Shockly Adams. Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all former and other Wills and testaments at any time heretofore by me made, and ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in Witness therof I the said Luke Robeson have hereunto set My hand and Seal this Seventh day of September in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twelve.
