To my Grandson Alexander Due I give my negro boy named Valentine. To my granddaughter Sarah Due I give my negro boy named Frank and also my silver shoe buckels. To my Grandson William Due I give my best feather bed and furniture To my grandson Morgan Gilbert Brown I give my negro boy named Stephen To my grandson Joseph Brwn and my granddaughter Mary Brown I give my negro girl named Esther her and her increase to be equally divided between them To William Billard Son of Millie Bullard I give my negro boy named Alcock My six silver tea spoons I give to my daughters Mary Brown and Christian Due to be equally divided between them. My negro man slave ^{Named} Mark having grown old in my Service I do hereby will and ordain that he be forever hereafter free. And the Whole of my Real Estate and the remainder of my personal Estate I will to be Sold at Publick or private sale at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and the proceeds thereof to be applied to the payment of my debts and should there be any of the paid proceeds remaining after my debts are paid then in that case my Will is that the same be equally divided between my Son William and my daughters Mary and Christian.

And I do hereby appoint my Son in law James Due and my friends William Thomas Executors to this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal this fifteen
