First, I give and bequeath to my Sister Margaret Adams one negro woman named Nancy and her youngest child a girl named Louisa also one boy named Jackson son of the said Nancy to serve until he is eighteen years old at which time it is my will he shall be set free.

I Samuel Winds of the District of Marlborough and the State of South Carolina being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and appoint this to be my last Will and Testament. First, I give and bequeath to my brother Thomas Winds one negro woman named Chania and one by the name of Lisa and one by the name of Maria and also my horses and household and kitchen furniture and to collect all that is owing to me and pay all my debts.
