Steven Parker of the State and District aforesaid, being sick of body but of a sound mind and of a disposing memory praise be God for the same, do make this my last will and Testament. First, I commit my soul into the Hands of God who Gave it resting my Hope in the Merite of Jesus Christ my Redeemer for a blessed immortality my body I commit to the grave requesting only a decent and Christian like burial. As to my worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to blefs me with I will and desire that it may be disposed of in the following manner. First I wish my funeral and burial expenses to be paid and all my Just debts likewise paid after which I give and bequeath to my sons Elisha Parker and shilling Sterling, to Elijah Parker one shilling Sterling, to Stern Parker Parker one shilling Sterling to my daughter Elizabeth Rye one shilling Sterling I give or lend to my son in law Cannon Weaver, a lot of land known by the name of Parker's boat yard together with all my boat yard Tools and all my lumber or timber that may be in the boat yard the above property I lend to him for the term of fifteen years then to return into the hands of my Executors hereafter to be named for my dearly beloved wife Agnefs Parker. To my son David Parker I give one shilling Sterling to Prudence Bailey I give one shilling Sterling. Lastly I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Agnefs Parker a tract of land whereon I now live commonly called Bailey's Tract supposed to be about 150 acres, all my stock consisting of horses, cattle, hogs, sheep, &c. all my plantat ion & carpenter's tools except my boat yard tools already disposed of as above, one wagon, one riding chair, one Oac carriage and 2 log chains, one lock chain one yoke of young oxen, together with all my and one old oxen

household and kitchen furniture----- I do hereby constitute and appoint my particular friends Joseph Ingram Sen.<sup>r</sup>, Lemuel Ingram Son of Joseph Ingram Sen.<sup>r</sup> both of Anson County North Carolina and Archibald Ellis of Chesterfield District South Carolina-----Executors to this my Last will and Testament revoking all others I declare this to be my last Will. Turn Over.
