a declining State of health but of sound mind & of a dis-
posing memory through the mercy of God, do make this my Last
will and Testament.

First I commend my Soul into the hands of God who gave it
resting my hope in the merits of Jesus Christ my redeemer
for a blessed immortality my body I commit to the grave
requesting only a decent & Christian like burial. As to my
worldly estate whatever it hath pleased God to bless me I
will and desire that it may be disposed of in the following
manner that is to say.

1. I will and desire that my land whereon I now live be and
remain in the possession of my beloved wife during her nat-
ural life should she not marry but if she marries my will is
that she shall have one half whereon my house stands during
her natural life and after her decease the whole of my land
to belong to my son Adam Lisenby.

2. I will that as soon as either of my daughters Mary Frankey
& Mary Lisenby may marry that they shall have one Cow & Calf
and one bed and furniture and after the death of my Wife the
whole of my Stock of cattle, sheep, & hogs to be equally divided
between my three daughters above mentioned, otherwise to re-
main in the possession of my beloved wife Frankey Lisenby during
her natural life.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my well beloved wife Frankey
Lisenby Executrix to this my last will and Testament Revoking
all others I declare this my last will in witness whereof I have
this day- 8th April Set my hand and seal in the year of 1825.
