I know all men by these presents that we Nancy Conner, Lewis Stubbs and James Bolton of the county and State aforesaid, are held and firmly bound and obliged unto the Justices of the County aforesaid, in the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds Sterling, to be paid unto the said Justices of the said Court, for the time being in the said office, to their attorney or successors in office, to which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, administrators and assigns jointly and severally firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals, and dated in the County aforesaid the first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety nine, and of the Independence of the United States of America the Twenty Fourth, Whereas administration of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of William Conner deceased, was lately committed by Justices of the County Court aforesaid unto the said Nancy Conner.

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Nancy Conner administratrix of the goods, chattels and credits of William

Conner deceased, to make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Nancy Conner or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for her, and the same so made, to exhibit unto the said Court of Marlborough, when she shall be therunto required, and such goods, chattels and credits so well and truly administered according to Law, and to make a true and just account of her doings and goings therein when required by the said Court, and all the rest of the said Goods, chattels and credits which be found remaining upon the account of the said administration, the same being first being allowed by the said Court, shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively, as are intitled to the same by Law, and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and Testament was made by the said deceased, and the same be proved in Court, and the Executors obtain a certificate of the probate thereof, and the said Nancy Conner to in such case, if required, render and deliver up the said letters of Administration, then this obligation to be void or else to remain in full force.

Letter of Administration

Whereas William Conner late of our said County deceased died within the same. Whereby the power of granting administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased within this state, and also of auditing the accounts, calculations, and reckonings of the said administration, and final dispensation of the same to us belonging, in order that the said goods and chattels rights and credits may be well and truly administered. We do hereby grant unto you the said Nancy Conner full power by the tenor of these present, to administer all and singular the goods and chattels rights and credits of the said deceased within this state which to him in

his life time, and at the time of his death did belong, and to ask, levy, recover and receive the same, and pay all his debts in which the said deceased stood obliged, as far forth as his goods and chattels, rights and credits will extend according to the rate and order of Law, and to make a just and true account, calculation and reckoning when thereunto required, And we do ordain, appoint and constitute you the said Nancy Conner administratrix of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased.
