Before me William Hopton one of the Majorities Justices assigned and keep the record for the county aforesaid, personally appeared Michael Golygon of Charleston in the County of Berkeley, keeper, who being by me duly sworn made oath on the Holy Evangelist that Conrad Moyer late of the Forks of Broad River now deceased & laborer, came of age of land that while the said Conrad Moyer was in Charleston he fell sick at the house of that deponent & in about a week died there, that while he was so sick he desired this deponent to go to the Secretaries Office for the said Plat & grant for him so he was disabled to go himself by much sickness which this deponent did according & paid to the Secretary two pounds ten shillings for his fees for the same, that the said Conrad Moyer on his death bed told the deponent that he had sold the said land to John Cannon of the Forks between Broad River, Planter, for some cattle, which said Conrad Moyer desired this deponent in said Canon that he the sickness to take those cattle that he had so sold his land for as his own for the expense and trouble he was at with him in his sickness & that he would deliver for the said plat and grant of the said 100 acres of land to the said John Cannon and make nothing for the same to him but that the said Conrad Moyer died without making any will or writing that he knows of nor has any other effects that he knows of, but that this deponent hath delivered the said plat and grant of the said land to the said John Cannon agreeable to the desire of the said Conrad Moyer, that he verily believes that the said land by virtue of the plat and grant for the said land is now produced to me the plat is certified the 27th Sept. 1758 by George J. H. Esq. General & Province & tested by his Excellency James Olen Esquire & commander in chief in and over the said province, sworn to before me the 12th, June 1765.

writing under their or any of their hands & Seals, ready to be
delivered to said parties in difference by the first day of May

Musgrove & Allen Roberson by their several bonds dated March 22nd,
1792 (this present date) are respectively bound to each other in
the penal sum of two hundred pounds sterling to stand to perform
and keep the order award and final determination of us the said
Mercer Babbs, Kisha Ford, Wallace Jones, Mark Smith & Peter Julia so
as the awarding and ready to be delivered to the
parties in difference by the first day of May next ensuing. We the
said Arbitrators above mentioned & herewith subscribed & Seals
affirm do make and publish this our Award Between the said parties
in difference as follows (viz) that is to say said Robison to pay
into William Musgrove on or before the first day of January next
five pounds and pay costs, as our Doctors Seals and other costs
that are reasonable that have occurred by the said award that said
Allen Robison gave to said William Musgrove at the house of Henry
Creek on the 15th October last past, all matters concerning said
quarrels or dispute are finally settled hereby and under our
hands and seals this 22nd of March 1792 which costs are as follows,
to Henry Tate Senr. Ten dollars & Arramatis Wilcox ten dollars to
be paid against the said Musgrove for his award and expenses
no charge against the said Musgrove for his award and expenses in
said time this being a final end to said controversy at his intents
& purposes,
