Slay, one small table & looking glass, my chest and all that is
contained in it, one half of the poultry that may be on the
place, two choice sheep, all my knives forks & spoons, four
earthen plates, one set tea cups & saucers, one pot, spider
and oven lid, one pot rack, my wheat patch, all the present
crop of corn & cotton etc, that is made on the place that I
would be entitled to, which is one half, one patch of sweet
potatoes, to her & heirs for ever

Second my will and desire is that all the balance of my property
be sold to the highest bidder to pay my just debts and the over
plus (if any) I give to my said daughter Hatty Priscock

Third & lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my son John
McMaster my Executor to this my last will and Testament, In
