Consideration £ 50 sterling. 125 acres including from a shole on the north side of Patterson's creek E 94 ° 56 chains S 15 ° 10 35 to a post oak N 75 W 28 to a stake S 45 W 80 to a red oak N 25 W 10 to a hickory N 33 W 10 to an ash thence to a second ash S 45 W 2 to the creek & along the various courses of the creek to the begining, being the East end of a 230 acre tract on Patterson Creek, Bounded S by land of Jno. Patterson, E by land laid out, all other sides by vacant land which was originally granted to s.d.
