

WILL OF

ELIJAH LYNCH.

In the name of God, Amen. I Elijah Lynch of Newberry District being weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind and memory calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous to dispose of such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, do make and ordain this my last Will in the manner following that is to say

1st I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be ~~paid~~ first paid

2nd I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Lynch four hundred dollars and two beds and furniture

3rd I desire that all my estate both Real and personal be sold by my executor and the monies arising from the sale thereof to be distributed in the following manner

4th In addition to the above mentioned four hundred dollars and beds, I give to my Wife one third part of the money arising from the sale of my Estate, and the balance which is two thirds to be divided into eight equal shares and given to my children and grandchildren as follows

5th I give to my granddaughter Harriet Hesterly one half of one share, the other half of said share I give to my son in law Joseph W. Summers in trust for the sole use and benefit of my Grandson John E. Summers to be paid to my grandson when he arrives to the age of twenty one years

6th I give to my son i law John L. Morgan in trust for my three grandchildren Elijah Elmore, Appleten Elmore and Elizabeth Elmore one share, to be given to them on their severally arriving to the age of twenty one years each child to have an equal part

7th I give to my Daughter Polly Bowers and her husband Jacob Bowers one share

8th I give to my son David Lynch one share

10th I give in trust to my son Giles C. Lynch one share, for the sole use and benefit of my daughter Margaret Quattlebaum and her children, to be advanced to them as my said son Giles C. may see that they have need

11th I give to my daughter Harriet, Morgan and her husband John L. Morgan one share

12th And to my son Giles C. Lynch one share

13th And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son Giles C. Lynch Executor of this my last Will and Testament by me heretofore made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand Seal this 6th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two
