2nd I wish the sum of three thousand dollars to be raised out of my estate and set apart for the sole and seperate use of my Sister Harriet E Swans Children, to be kept at interest in the hands of my Executors untill her youngest Child becomes twenty one years of age then to bee equally divided among all of her children

3rd I will to John Swindler the following negro Slaves viz Winston George Will, wills wife Ursly Hannah & Tuck. I also will and bequeath unto the said John Swindler my Stoncy point tract of land containing one hundred and seventeen acres more or less I further bequeath to the afforsaid John Swindler three hundred dollars in cash and one Mare pigeon and one gray horse Leviathan and one choice bead one choice steed and a Sufficient quantity of furnature for said bead -- to be his forever.

4th I further will that John Swindlers Mother Joice Swindler live with him on Said Stoncy point tract of land if she cho ses so to doe and have the entire controll of all of the property which I have set apart for his the said John Swindlers use untill he arrives to the age of twenty one years.

5th I farther will and desire that if the aforesaid John Swindler should die leaving no issue then Joice Swindler Shall become the

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5th I farther will and desire that if the aforesaid John Swindler should die leaving no issue then Joice Swindler shall become the sole heir of all his estate which may arrive from my bequest to him in this will.

6th I further will that if the aforesaid Joice Swindler should survive her son John Swindler and become the Heir to his estate by this my will that she is only entitled to the use of said property so long as she may live, and after her death that it be equally divided between My brother F. F. Calmes Harriet N Swan & Nancy Harrington.

7th I further desire that all of my negroes which are not Pre-

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viously disposed of in this my will be appraised by three dis-
interested men allotted and drawn for by My brother F F Calnes
& my Sister Nancy Harrington

8th I farther will and devise that all of the residue of my es-
tate both real and personal be ~~sold and the proceeds~~ not pre-
viously disposed of ^{in this my will} be sold and the proceeds be equally divid-
ed between My brother F F Calnes and my Sister Nancy Harrington
to be vested in them respectively their heirs and assigns forever.

9th I nominate and appoint Thos H Pope and Dr William Harrington
executors of this my will given under my hand and seal this
third day of February ~~thirteen~~ hundred and forty four.
