del, also I give to my four well beloved Daughters fift-
pound seven shillings and seven pence Current money of South
Carlinah also I give and bequeath the Remainer of my household
furnetur into the hands of my wife and William flaued the ex-
eters for the scouling and raising of my Childring Whome I
Likewise Constitute make and ordain the sole exectrix of this
my Last will and testament all and Singular and tenements by
her freely to be Possessed and in Joyed and I do hereby uterly
disalow revouke and disannul all and every other former testa-
ments Will Lagacees bequests and executors by me in any wise
before named and bequeathed Ratifyinh and Confirming this and
no other to be my Last Will and testament witnefs whereof I
have hereunte set my hand and seal this thirtyfirst day of march
in the year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred & eighty sev-

Iack parmer as his Last will and testament
