First, I will order and direct that all my personal and real estate be sold as soon after my decease as practible on the usual credite and that out of the moneys ~~extacting~~ therefrom my just debts and funeral expences be first paid

SECOND I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Isabel Senn the sum of twentyfive dollars and to Rhoda Rees twenty dollars.

THIRD The balance after paying ~~paying~~ off the above Legacies to be equally divided amongst my four daughters or their surviving heirs namely Mary McClung Elizabeth Murdock Jane Plunket and the heirs of Sarah Coppeck Dece^d Solomon Coppeck and Joseph Coppeck. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my soninlaw Hamilton Plunket my true and lawful Executor of this my last will and testament by me heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament.
