extra and bedstead and James a bay coal and Drayton a horse
worth fifty Dollars these my children to have this extra of their
Distributive share of my Estate, and also Levi to have one hun-
dred and seventy five Dollars out. John Lomino and his wife
Nelly, share of my Estate The ballance of the property not
