being infirm in body, but of perfect mind and memory, do think
proper to make this my last will and Testament, in manner and
form following, (to wit)

First. I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Fanny Taylor
one bedstead in the room, and all the bedding which may be on
it, my Saddle, and one hundred Dollars in money: to her during
her life, and after her death to the heirs of her body, and them
only.

Secondly. My will and desire is, that all the balance of the
property which I may have at the time of my death, be sold to
the highest bidder by my Executor, and the money arising there-
from, and all the / money which I may die possessed of, be
equally divided between my two sons and four Daughters. (viz)
Andrew Dominick, David Dominick, Nancy Hilboarn, Elizabeth Neely,
Christenah Workman and Fanny Taylor.

Thirdly I do hereby nominate and appoint my trusty friend John
Hair -- my Executor to this my last will and Testament--
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
20th day of February 1841
