

# WILL OF

## MARGARET ENLOW.

The Last Will and testament of Margaret Enlow of Newberry District and State of South Carolina Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory (blessed be Almighty God for the Same) do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following. (that is to say) First to my Eldest Daughter Elizabeth Enlow ~~Wife of J. J. Enlow~~ I give and bequeath her Saddle and a chest and one corner cupboard. Also to my eldest son William Enlow I Give one Sow and pigs, one Hieffer Two Dollars and one note for rent amounting to Twenty Dollars, the sow & pigs, Hieffer and Two Dollars he has already got. Also to my son Noah Enlow I Give one Bay Horse and a note which I hold againa him my said son Noah Enlow for the Sum of Fifty Three Dollars and sixty three cents bearing Date the Fifteenth Day of August 1845 if the said note is not paid before my Death. Also to my Daughter Polly Enlow one Bead Sted Bed and Furniture and a note for the sum three Dollars and Twenty Five cents bearing date the Fifteenth Day of august 1845.. Also to my youngest Daughter Mary A. M. Enlow I give my bead and Furniture and Bed Sted and one note for the sum of Two Dollars and Fifty cents Bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> day of August 1845. Also to my Deaughter polly Enlow one Calf, a Hieffer Also to my yjungeest Deaughter Mary, A. M. Enlow one cow, and to my Deaughter Elizabeth Enlow and my son Noah Enlow I give and bequeath the Remainder of my Stock of cow. Also to my three Deaughters Elizabeth Enlow Polly Enlow & Mary A. M. Enlow & my son Noah Enlow I give and bequeath all my land forever to them and their Issue to have and to hold the said lands and tenements ~~common so long as they can live together,~~ <sup>may</sup> but if either one should mary or become Dissatisfied the married / have their part cut off and settle on it but Should they not agree to live together the Land Shall be Rented and the profits thence arising shall be Equall

my eldest son William Enlow I Give one Sow and pigs, one Hieffer  
Two Dollars and one not for rent amounting to Twenty Dollars, the  
sow & pigs, Hieffer and Two Dollars he has already got. Also to  
my son Noah Enlow I Give one bay Horse and a note which I hold  
against him my said son Noah Enlow for the Sum of Fifty Three Dol-  
lars and sixty three cents bearing Date the Fifteenth Day of Au-  
gust 1845 if the said note is not paid before my Death. Also to  
my Daughter Polly Enlow one Bead Sted Bed and Furniture and a note  
for the sum three Dollars and Twenty Five cents bearing date the  
Fifteenth Day of August 1845.. Also to my youngest Daughter Mary  
A. M. Enlow I give my bead and Furniture and Bed Sted and one note  
for the sum of Two Dollars and Fifty cents Bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup>  
day of August 1845. Also to my Daughter Polly Enlow one Calf,  
a Hieffer Also to my youngest Daughter Mary, A. M. Enlow one cow,  
and to my Daughter Elizabeth Enlow and my son Noah Enlow I give  
and bequeath the Remainder of my Stock of cows, Also to my three  
Daughters Elizabeth Enlow Polly Enlow & Mary A. M. Enlow & my  
son Noah Enlow I give and bequeath all my land forever to them and  
their Issue to have and to hold the said lands and tenements  
~~as long as they can live together,~~ but if either one should  
die or become Dissatisfied <sup>may</sup> have their part cut off  
and settle on it but Should they not agree to live together the  
Land Shall be Rented and the profits thence arising shall be Equal  
Divided amongst them, and my son William Enlow Shall also have an  
equal part of the Rent with the other children Should the premises  
aforementioned be Rented out to other persons but so long as my  
said children Shall continue to live together on the said premises  
he Shall not Exact any Rent from them or any one of them.

And Lastly, I do will and direct that all debts due me  
at my Death Shall be collected by my son Noah Enlow whom I hereby

appoint sole Executor of this my last will and testament, and my Debts and Funeral charges paid out of the same and should there not be Money enough coming to me to pay all the Debts due by me at my Death My said Executor shall select Equally off the Legatees with himself to pay the said Debts.
