manner and form. first I desire that I desire that all my Just

1<sup>st</sup> I do give to my beloved dauter Almeda Smith one Negro  
girl About twenty four or five years of age by the name of Fanny  
and also one Negro boy by the name of Will about sixteen years  
of age to will and dispose off as she pleases.

2<sup>nd</sup> It is my will and that my oustand debts go to pay my Just  
debts and the remaindr to go to my beloved daughter Almeda also.

3<sup>rd</sup> It is farther more my will and desire that the rest of my  
children Westly Smith Gilliam Smith Patsy Williams should have at  
my death twenty five cents apiece

4<sup>th</sup> It is further my will and desire that my beloved dauger Al-  
meda Smith should have the remains of my Estate. that is house  
hold and furniture to dispose of as she pleases. I do consecrate

1<sup>st</sup> I do give to my beloved daughter Almada Smith one Negro girl about twenty four or five years of age by the name of Fanny and also one Negro boy by the name of Will about sixteen years of age to will and dispose off as she pleases.

2<sup>nd</sup> It is my will and that my outstanding debts go to pay my Just debts and the remainder to go to my beloved daughter Almada also.

3<sup>rd</sup> It is farther more my will and desire that the rest of my children Vestly Smith Gilliam Smith Patsy Williams should have at my death twenty five cents apiece

4<sup>th</sup> It is further my will and desire that my beloved daughter Almada Smith should have the remains of my Estate. that is house hold and furniture to dispose of as she pleases. I do consecrate and appoint my beloved daughter Almada Smith Executrix to this my last will and testament, revoking and making null and void all former wills and testaments In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this the twenty second day of March in the year of our Lord in the year of our lord Eighteen Hundred and Thirty two
