In the name of god amen I Mary Chapman widow: being weak of body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament as follows: I leave to Each of my Sisters Ann Laramore: Elenor Douglafe Sarah Burch and Brigit Scott twenty five dollars and I leave my wearing apparel to Elenor Douglafe: I leave my Rocking Chair to my Daughter Mary Ann Glenn: I leave twenty five dollars to Five of my grand daughters Each: twenty five dollars to Mary E. Caldwell twenty five dollars twenty five dollars to Jane E. Caldwell: twenty five dollars to Mary S. Glenn: twenty five dollars to Mary Sophia Chapman: and twenty five dollars to Mary Susan Logans: and Fifty dollars to my Daughter Ann L Brown: I also leave my Bed Furniture to her: I leave my Bed Woodsstead Mahap Bolsters & pillows to my grand Daughter Mary E. Caldwell: I also leav my Teender Fire Irons & Bureau to my grand daughter M. E. Caldwell I leave my large Trunk to my daughter Sarah B. Caldwell the remainder of my Estate I leave to James P. Caldwell I leave James P. Caldwell my Sole Executor of this my last will: Signed in presence of
