Caldwell twenty five dolls twenty five dolls to Jane H. Caldwell: twenty five dolls to Mary S. Glenn: twenty five dolls to Mary Sophia Chapman: and twenty five dolls to Mary Susan Logan: and Fifty dolls to my Daughter Ann L. Brown: I also leave my Bed Furniture to her: I leave my Bed Headstead Mahap Bolsters & pillows to my grand Daughter Mary E. Caldwell: I also leave my Teender Fire Irons & Bureau to my grand daughter M. E. Caldwell I leave my large Trunk to my daughter Sarah B. Caldwell the remainder of my Estate I leave to James P.
