MILLY WALDROP

State of South Carolina

I Milly Waldrop of the District of Newberry and State afor. said being at this time of sound mind, memory and understanding do herein and hereby declare the following instrument to contain my last Will and Testament.

Clause 1st My will and desire is, that as soon after my Death as convenient, that all my personal property (My old searvant Silvy excepted) that I may be possessed of at that time, be sold to the highest bidder on a credit of Twelve Months, and out of the proceeds of the same, I desire that all my Just debts and funeral expenses be paid.

Clause 2nd My will and desire, is that all monies due me before my death, and also all that may arise from the sale of my property or otherwise, be collected and so much as is necessary be applied to the payment of my just debts as above mentioned

Clause 3rd My will and desire is, that shortly after my death that my friend B.F. Griffin take charge of my old servant Silvy, and see to her general welfare that she may be provided with all the necessary comforts of life, so long as she may live, for which attention, and his kind attention to me during my life, I will and bequeath unto him the said B. F. Griffin, and his heirs forever, all that Plantation or tract of land whereon I now live, containing seventy acres more or less, and I will and desire further is ; that my old searvant Silvy, be permitted to live on the above mentioned tract of land so long as she may live, or choose to do so, my friend B. F. Griffin takeing charge of her as his own right and property, paying her taxes and all other expenses necessary for her comfort, as before mentioned

Clause 4th My will and desire, is That within six months after

Clause 2nd My will and desire, is that all monies due me before my death, and also all that may arise from the sale of my property or otherwise, be collected and so much as is necessary be applied to the payment of my just debts as above mentioned

Clause 3rd My will and desire is, that shortly after my death that my friend B.F. Griffin take charge of my old servant Silvy, and see to her general welfare that she may be provided with all the necessary comforts of life, so long as she may live, for which attention, and his kind attention to me during my life, I will and bequeath unto him the said B. F. Griffin, and his heirs forever, all that Plantation or tract of land whereon I now live, containing seventy acres more or less, and my will and desire further is ; that my old searvant Silvy, be permitted to live on the above mentioned tract of land so long as she may live, or choose to do so, my friend B. F. Griffin takeing charge of her as his ~~own right and property~~ ~~paying her taxes~~ and all other ~~expenses~~ necessary for her comfort, as before mentioned---

Clause 4th My will and desire, is That within six months after the death of my old searvant Silvy that my Executor give or pay to my friend Simon Brooks for his Kind attention to me in my life^{time} , Fifty Dollars for his use and benefit---

Clause 5th My will and desire is, that within six months after the death of my old searvant Silvy that my Executor give or pay to my friend Susan Waldrop (widow of Samuel Waldrop) Three Hundred Dollars if so much be left in his hands after paying all demands that may come against my estate that are just, and the fifty

Dollars given to my friend Simon Brooks; and in the event that any thing should be left, after paying out the above specified amounts, I will and bequeath it to my friend B. F. Griffin and his heirs forever.

Clause 6th I do herein and hereby constitute my friend B. F. Griffin my lawful Executor to carry into due execution this my last will and Testament.
