which issued from the court of common pleas at Cambridge aforesaid
Viz, William Thompson against Phillimon Waters dated the thirteenth
day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and ninety five directed to all and singular the Sheriffs of the
said state which execution was duly lodged and entered in the Sheriff
office for the district aforesaid on the 13th November in the year
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety five the said
William Tenant did enter upon and seize under the said execution two

January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and

Benjamin Glover (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) hath
granted bargained and sold unto the said Benjamin Glover and to his

containing two hundred acres more or less surveyed for Phillimon
Waters the eighth of September one thousand seven hundred and eight
eight on the waters of Saluda River bounded by lands S.E. N.W. unknown
N.E. part Sumperts and lands unknown also one other plantation or
tract of land containing two hundred acres more or less surveyed
for Phillimon Waters the fourteenth of June one thousand seven
hundred and ninety two situate on the waters of whites branch, big
creek and Cannons Creek in the district of Ninety Six, bounded by
