RICHARD ANDERSON

State of South Carolina

In the name of God Amen!

I Richard Anderson of the District of Newberry and state a-
foresaid being weak in body but of sound mind memory and under-
standing do make and publish my last will and testament as fol-
lows to wit,

1st I will and direct all my just debts to be paid

2^d I will, order, direct, and devise the whole of my real and
personal estate to be sold on a credit of twelve months, by my
Executors, herein after named. In such sale twenty five feet
square of my land at and including the grave yard will be re-
served for a burying ground for my family. I wish it to be well
ditched and the expense to be paid out of my estate.

3^d I give and bequeath to my wife Jane Anderson and her heirs
forever the sum of Thirty dollars, in lieu of and in bar of dower,
and every other claim on my estate.

4th I give to my son Richard Spencer four hundred dollars to be
to him and to his children after his death, but if he should die
before he receives the said sum and without children then this
sum will fall into the residuum of my estate to be distributed as
herein after directed.

5th I give to my son Whitfield Jones, the sum of Two hundred dol-
lars to be to him and his children after his death, but if he
should die before he receives the said sum and without children
then this sum will fall into the residuum of my estate to be dis-
tributed as hereinafter directed.

6th. I will order and direct that the residue of my estate be di-
vided among my five children, Elizabeth Sally, Whitfield Jones,

1st I will and direct all my just debts to be paid

2d I will, order, direct, and devise the whole of my real and personal estate to be sold on a credit of twelve months, by my Executors, herein after named. In such sale twenty five feet square of my land at and including the grave yard will be reserved for a burying ground for my family. I wish it to be well ditched and the expense to be paid out of my estate.

3d I give and bequeath to my wife Jane Anderson and her heirs forever the sum of Thirty dollars, in lieu of and in bar of dower, and every other claim on my estate.

4th I give to my son Richard Spencer four hundred dollars to be to him and to his children after his death, but if he should die before he receives the said sum and without children then this sum will fall into the residuum of my estate to be distributed as herein after directed.

5th I give to my son Whitfield Jones, the sum of Two hundred dollars to be to him and his children after his death, but if he should die before he receives the said sum and without children then this sum will fall into the residuum of my estate to be distributed as hereinafter directed.

6th. I will order and direct that the residue of my estate be divided among my five children, Elizabeth Sally, Whitfield Jones, Sarah, and Richard Spencer in equal shares; but if either of my children should die before attaining to full age and without children then the part of such child so dying is to be distributed among the survivors. The share of my estate which each of my children may receive is to be ^{to} such child and to his or her children after his or her death: and my Executors on paying over each share will take a receipt according to this provision of my will

7th I hereby constitute and appoint my friend John Belton O'Neill

Executor of this my will, and testamentary Guardian of my children and direct him to see that they have a good English education, and that they be brought up to earn an honest living by industry.

I hereby revoke all other and former wills by me made.
