 my Executors Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I
 shall Receive the Same again by the mighty Power of God and as

 Bless me in this Life I Give devise and dispose of the same in
 the following Manner That is to say First I Give and bequeath
 Unto my Sister Marthy Grasty One Negro Girl Named Milley and al-
 so One Hundred and fifty Acres of Land on the Waters of Beaver-
