1-- I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Henrietta M Eppes the following named negroes viz one negro man named Ned one negro woman Sophy one boy Jack one man Clayborn one woman Clarissa one girl Louisa and also my Barouch & two horses Sam & Basscombe and one good feather bed & furniture all which property I wish my wife Henrietta aforesaid to have and enjoy during her natural life and at her death to be given to my two Sons John & James in the maner herein after to named.

2-- I give & bequeath to my son John W.Eppes the following negroes one man named Frank one woman Patsy one woman Silvey one boy President one girl Teby one boy Gideon one boy George one girl Francis one boy Adam and one girl named Rachael and also two feather Beds & furniture my Set of Dining Tables 1/2 Dozen Indore Chaires and the rocking Chair all which I wish my son John W.Eppes to have at my death and at the death of my wife aforesaid I will & bequeath to him the said John W.Eppes the three first named negroes as given to my wife Henrietta during her natural life, that is to say the aforesaid negro man

one girl Francis one boy Adam and one girl named Rachael and
also two feather Beds & furniture my Set of Dining Tables 1/2
Dozen Windsor Chaise and the rocking Chair all which I wish my
son John W.Eppes to have at my death and at the death of my
wife aforesaid I will & bequeath to him the said John W.Eppes
the three first named negroes as given to my wife Henrietta
during her natural life, that is to say the aforesaid negro man
Ned the woman Sophy & the boy Jack.

3-- I give and bequeath to my Son James K. Eppes the following
negroes one man Hal boy Allen woman Manurva girl Mary boy Charles
boy Robin girl Chana & one girl Sally and also two beds &
furniture and my Secretary & Book case, and 1/2 Dozen Windsor

Chairs all which I wish my son James M. Eppes to have at my death and the death of my wife Henrietta aforesaid I give & bequeath to my son James aforesaid the three last mentioned negroes as given to my wife Henrietta M. Eppes during her natural life that is to say the man Clayborn the woman Clarifea & the girl Louisa.

4-- My further will is that all my real estate consisting of the tract whereon I live containing 400 acres and the tract in fork of Duncans Creek & Enoree River containing 100 acres and all my personal property of every description not herein other wise disposed of be sold by my Executors at such time and on such terms as will be most satisfactory to my Creditors and advantageous to my Estate, and ~~and my executors shall apply the~~ that the proceeds be applied to the payment of my debts if so much be necessary and provided that there should be any overplus of this fund after paying all my just debts my wish is that it be equally divided between my two sons John & James before mentioned.

5-- my further will is that when my five grandchildren William W. Hudson James R. Hudson Daniel E. Hudson John W. Hudson Thomas E. Hudson, arrive at the age of twenty one. My two Sons Shall pay in equal proportions the sum of fifty Dollars to each one of them as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty one as aforesaid my Son John paying twenty five Dollars and my Son James paying twenty five Dollars to each one as they arrive at the age of twenty one but in the event that either of my grandchildren aforesaid should die before they arrive at the age aforesaid then nothing is to be claimed on the ~~amount~~ of those so dying but only

twenty one but in the event that either of my grandchildren
aforesaid should die before they arrive at the age aforesaid then
nothing is to be claimed on the account of those so dying but only
for such as live to the age of twenty one. And I do hereby con-
stitute & appoint my two Sons John W. Eppes & James H. Eppes
