The Last WILL and Testament

of William Harmon-----

In the name of GOD, Amen.-----

I William Harmon of the State and District aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased GOD to blefs me with DO make and ordain this my last Will in the manner following, that is to Say-----

First. I desire that all my personal property be sold as soon after my death as my Executors shall think advisable and on a credit of twelve months, and that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of the amount sales of my personal property, and such debts as I may have owing to me and money on hand at the time of my Death. (if any)-----

Secondly. I desire that all my land or real Estate be sold in a body as soon after my Death as my Executors think advisable and on a Credit of one, two and three years, the payment for which is to be secured by mortgage or ample security.-----

Thirdly. To the amount of my personal property left after my debts are paid is to be added four Hundred Dollars for which I hold the receipt of my son in Law Rev.^d John Watts and these sums added to the amount of my land will give the Nett value of my Estate which after the legal deductions made to my Executors I wish divided in the following manner. To wit. To my beloved wife Bridget in addition to a previous settlement of a negro woman

and ordain this my last Will in the manner following, that is
to say-----

First. I desire that all my personal property be sold as soon
after my death as my Executors shall think advisable and on a

Secondly. I desire that all my Land or real Estate be sold in a
body as soon after my Death as my Executors think advisable and

to be secured by mortgage or ample security.-----

Thirdly. To the amount of my personal property left after my
debts are paid is to be added four Hundred Dollars for which I
hold the receipt of my son in law Rev.^d John Watts and these sums
added to the amount of my Land will give the Nett value of my
Estate which after the legal deductions made to my Executors I
wish divided in the following manner. To wit. To my beloved wife
Bridget in addition to a previous settlement of a negro woman
and ~~one~~ one third of my Nett Estate as above. To my son John
L. Harmon in addition to what I have already done for him Four
Hundred Dollars, and the remainder of my Estate I wish divided
Share and share alike amongst my eight Children. that is to say.
To Mary Watts in addition to two hundred Dollars in Cash given
her and also in addition to whatever I have given her before
except the four Hundred Dollars aboveserfered to one eight of the
remainder above spoken of - To Betsey spearman in addition to
what I have given her one Eight. To Jesse Harmon in addition to
a place purchased for him and what I have already given him one

eight. To William P. Harmon in addition to what I have already given him one eight. To Della Landony in addition to what I have already given her one eight. To Nancy Harmon in addition to what I have already given her her one eight. To Thos F. Harmon and Sarah I. Harmon in addition to the provision already made for them each one eight.

Lastly. I do hereby constitute and appoint my Father in law Tho^s Preen and my friend the Hon John Belton O'Reall Executors of this my last Will and Testament by me heretofore made. In testimony - whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the second day of November one Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty.
