In the name of God, amen. I Bredy Cox of the State of South Carolina and County of Penitton, being weak in body of sound Memory. (Signed by God) do this 15th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety four and in the twentieth year of the Independence of America make and publish this my last will & Testament in Manner following (that is to say) I give and bequeath (all my Estate Real and Personal such as my lands with the rents and all other profits arising therefrom my stocks with their Increase & profits, with all my household furniture and debts owing to me, these & all other property goods and chattels whereof I shall be seized or in possession) to my dear wife Mary Cox for her own support and to the end and purpose that my children may be brought up supported and schooled, by & with the same Estate entire which shall remain in my P. wife Mary Cox's possession & she the said Mary Cox shall have the rule & Government of the or the same (she making as wattle thereof) untill the least of my children or the youngest that shall then be living shall arise (as an age that the Law has appointed, that a person shall act and do for themselves) and that time all the said Estate which is then Remaining and profits arising therefrom shall be equally divided between each and every one of my children except a third part which she my P. wife Mary Cox shall hold during her natural life, if she be living at the time when this my Estate shall be divided & after her decease to be divided Equally as the other parts of my Estate, between all my P. children, but if my P. wife Mary Cox shall die before the time, above limited, for the Estate to be divided, then some other person (appointed by my P. wife
