Archibald Boyd and others, also another tract of 150 acres more or less on waters
of 12 mile river joining lands lately owned by Martin and others the first
above mentioned plantation being the same whereon the said Jacob Light dec^d lately

lived. bring a part of several Grants. the other tract of 150 acres bring the plantation lately sold by John Linn to Eben Light. Should not be divided or sold, Allotting to Jacob Light the applicant and Tyce Light Sanders Light Obadiah Light, George Light, John Light Jones & Polly his Wife, James Dairman and Budget his Wife, Samy Newman and Jerry his Wife, Equal portions of the same.

for one third, two years for one third and three years for balance except so much

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of the premises if deemed necessary to the Ordinary for the
payment of the purchase money.
